Chad is a best-selling author, president of his own Communications Company, Chad Hymas Communications, Inc., and is a recognized world-class wheelchair athlete. In 2003, Chad set a world record by wheeling his chair from Salt Lake City to Las Vegas (513 miles).

Bob Battles is director of government affairs on labor and employment issues and general counsel at the Association of Washington Business.

Battles has more than two decades of experience as an attorney specializing in workplace issues and government affairs. 
The program has both research and education-outreach components. An effective approach to whole farm nutrient management requires the




